**Penitential Service** The readings at Mass on Ash Wednesday started with the line "Return to me with all your heart". What better way to prepare for Easter by returning to God through the Sacrament of Reconciliation? On Friday 21<sup>st</sup> March at 5:30pm I'm going to give a talk on the Sacrament of Reconciliation(Confession) – How does it work? How do I prepare? What should I say? How can I get the most from the experience? What if I just keep saying the same things each time? I would like us to look at how we can celebrate this sacrament in an authentic way. After the talk at 6:30pm we will have a visiting priest join us (Fr John Browne) for a reconciliation service at which each person will have the chance to go to confession. You are welcome to come to both the talk and reconciliation service, or to come to one or the other. For those who are not going to Deanery Lenten Recollection day on Saturday morning, Fr John will hear Confessions, before Mass at 10:00am
