Mothering Sunday The fourth Sunday of Lent, known as Lætare Sunday, was traditionally the day one would return to one's 'mother church' i.e. the church of your Baptism. Of course, having returned home to the place of your birth and baptism, you would also make sure to see you mother (and father) too, or perhaps to lay flowers on her grave. In modern times this day has become 'Mothers' Day' and is a celebration of Motherhood. At the end of the Sunday Masses there will be the blessing of mothers, and prayers for our mothers who may have gone to their eternal reward.

Spring Forward (and fall back). Don't forget that the clocks go forward next weekend – 1:00am on Sunday 30th March will become 2:00am.

Altar Servers – Save the Date The Holy Week and Easter Liturgies are very beautiful but can be complicated. There will be a rehearsal of the Triduum celebrations for Altar servers on the afternoon/evening of Wednesday 16th April. If you would like to serve Mass during the Triduum, please do make sure you can come to the rehearsal. More information to follow soon.

Station Mass It is customary for a bishop to visit each of his deaneries and to celebrate the 'Station Mass' during the season of Lent – a tradition which has been longstanding within our former diocese. As the new diocese is now so much bigger, the bishop is continuing this tradition but will visit all the deaneries within the Lenten and Easter seasons. Our deanery of Our Lady of the Taper will host Archbishop Mark on Tuesday 29th May – the Solemnity of The Ascension of the Lord.

Chrism Mass During Holy Week the Bishop blesses the sacramental oil which will be used across the diocese for the following year. The three oils – oil of catechumens, oil of the infirm, and oil of Chrism – are taken from this Mass and brought to each of the parishes. The Chrism Mass is also the occasion when the clergy renew their ordination promises, and when the bishop preaches to them directly. This year the Chrism Mass will be at St Joseph's Cathedral at 11:30am on Tuesday 15th April (on alternate years the Chrism Mass shall alternate locations with and be celebrated at St David's Cathedral Cardiff).

Thank you Thank you to all who took part in last week's fire drill at Welsh Martyrs Church – the evacuation took place in 1min45sec, well inside the 3min limit. The only observation to make is that the meeting point at the lower part of the footbath would hinder emergency access, if required. Additionally, some congregated behind the church. Assisted suicide legislation Bishop John Sherrington, lead Bishop for life issues at the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, has placed a recording online explaining the objection to the proposed legislation passing through parliament seeking to legalise assisted suicide. Ahead of the Bill's Third Reading and vote, likely to take place in late April or early May, Bishop Sherrington insists all is not lost and that there's still time to contact your MP to ask them to oppose assisted suicide becoming law. Here in mid Wales we may not have the population to sustain a full 24 hours of confessions and adoration, but might I encourage everyone in the parish to consider investing 1 hour of prayer this coming Friday after Mass, or by coming to adoration on Saturday mornings – thereby uniting ourselves with this world-wide initiative?
