Pope Francis Since the last newsletter on Easter Sunday, we have said a fond farewell to Pope Francis who died on Easter Monday, and whose funeral was on Saturday. We have prayed for the repose of his soul and now we pray for the College of Cardinals who, after the days of mourning, will gather to elect a new successor to St Peter. The

death of the Pontiff means that the canonisation of Bl Carlo Acutis is not able to happen; as such we won't embark on the advertised Eucharistic procession this Sunday.

Funerals Please pray for the repose of the souls of Margaret Williams, Shirley Seagrave and Baby Ffion who have died recently. Margaret Williams's funeral service will take place on Saturday 3rd May at 2:00pm at Lledrod Villgae Chapel, this will be conducted in Welsh by Fr Matthew Roche-Saunders. Shirley Seagrave will have a private family service and Baby Ffion's funeral service will be conducted by Rev Lynn Rees at St John's Church later this week for family and friends.

Divine Mercy Sunday Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. This is the day of specific devotion to the Divine Mercy – that is, the vision of Christ Most Merciful, who appeared to Saint Sr Faustina Kowlaska. At 3:00pm the Chaplet of Divine Mercy shall be prayed in Welsh Martyrs Church and everyone is welcome to attend.

Students' Day Trip If you are a student at the University there is CathSoc trip to Caldey Island (weather and sea conditions for sailing depending) on Saturday 24th May. The plan is to depart at 8:00am in order to get an early sailing and to join the monastic community for the sung prayers.
