## **UPDATE on suggested Sunday Mass times**

You'll have a note of everything that was written about the suggested Sunday Mass times in last week's newsletter, and so what is written here is new information. If you didn't see last week's information and you'd like to, simply get in touch and I'll be glad to email you a copy.

A key component in this process is your prayer and your feedback - many, many thanks to those who have contacted me in person or by email to share your thoughts. It makes me sad that I'm not able to meet everyone's preference that's a reflection of the new reality we find ourselves in of multiple churches over a large area. However I've taken your comments on board and wish to suggest a new configuration. What follows, replaces the suggestion of last week's newsletter. This is an organic process, and the purpose of giving your feedback is so that we arrive at the best all-round decision by May 26th - you can assume that everything you read until then is still worthy of discussion. So, even if you've already been in touch with me, I'm grateful for any new feedback you may have about the following (the changes from last week are in **bold text**):

- Saturday 4.30pm: Holy Cross, Aberaeron
- Saturday 6.30pm: Welsh Martyrs, Aberystwyth
- Sunday 9am: Welsh Martyrs, Aberystwyth
- Sunday 11am: Welsh Martyrs, Aberystwyth
- Sunday 5.30pm: Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Lampeter

You'll notice that the Mass in Aberaeron has moved on by 30 minutes - this is because of bus timetables that mean a 4pm start is too early. Many thanks to the person who made me aware of this.

You'll notice too that the second Vigil Mass has reverted to Aberystwyth (albeit 30 minutes later than it currently starts).

You'll notice that the Sunday evening Mass has moved to Lampeter - this is based on feedback that if the parish of Lampeter has only one Mass, then a Mass on the Lord's Day of Sunday is preferable to a Mass that anticipates it on Saturday. I recognise that a Sunday morning Mass is preferable for many, and perhaps easier to access for those who travel a distance, or who don't wish to travel in the dark in winter time. But since the model we're looking for is to enable one priest to celebrate all the Masses when that's necessary, it's simply not possible to schedule this Mass for Sunday morning based on the current needs and size constraints of Welsh Martyrs Church.

I invite your comments on the above - no comment is too big or too small to share with me.

Please note that there will be no changes to Mass times until at least June 29th/30th.

**Our Lady of Mount Carmel** Pontfaen Road, Lampeter, SA48 7BS **Pentecost Novena** The word 'novena' meaning nine days of prayer, originally came from the experience of Our Lady and the apostles locked in the upper room between the Lord's Ascension and the day of Pentecost – their nine days of prayer have been taken as a model of prayer for disciples when praying about a particular intention. It's a really good thing to make something of this novena. Maybe you could consider each day one of the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: **love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control**. Come Holy Spirit, come! After each Mass this week we'll sing a hymn to invite the Holy Spirit into our hearts and into our parish life.

**Pentecost** Next Sunday is the feast of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Many people refer to this as the 'birthday of the Church' since without the power of the Holy Spirit we remain dormant and tempted to look inwards. To recall how the apostles spoke in many different languages on that first Pentecost, we'll pray the bidding prayers in the different languages of our parish – would you be happy to read a bidding prayer in your mother tongue next Sunday? Pope Francis has written about artificial intelligence, recently, saying that 'this time in history... risks becoming rich in technology and poor in humanity'. Let's pray that our parishes be rich in humanity! And that we can make use the means of technology to serve the Gospel. There is a second collection for the work of communications in the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales.

**Our Father Talk Series** The next talk in the series will be on the words, 'Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.' The session will be led by Sr Angela Murray, an Ursuline sister living in Cardigan, on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> May in Neuadd Goffa, following the 6pm Mass at Welsh Martyrs (therefore a likely start of around 6.45pm).

Marian Procession To honour Our Lady in her month of May, we'll have a Rosary procession with her image in Lampeter on Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> May after the 6pm Mass, and in Aberystwyth on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> May at 5pm. All welcome!

Holy Cross Garden We're planning to freshen up the garden at Holy Cross Church. Have you got ideas for how we can add plants or do a makeover of the beds? New Lectionary The translation of the scripture readings that we hear at Mass is changing in a few months' time. The translation we have at the moment is called the Jerusalem Bible, but is generally considered to emphasise 'conversational style' over 'faithfulness to the original texts'. The Bishops Conferences of the English-speaking world have decided to change the translation we hear at Mass to the **English Standard Version**, which is considered to be more faithful to the original texts while remaining very 'listenable'. That might mean some of the readings we're used to hearing will sound quite different – but it's a nice opportunity to refresh our relationship with the Word of God. This change will take place at the start of Advent this year. Parishes now need to order new versions, beautifully bound by the Catholic Truth Society. The lectionary will be published in four volumes, meaning we'll need four of the large 'Ambo editions' for each of our three churches, and a Book of the Gospels for each church too. We may also need smaller study editions of each volume. Would you be happy to sponsor one of these books, perhaps to be dedicated in memory of a loved one?
